SGMA & OVGA History

- ▶ In 2014, the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA) enacted
 - Requires basins rated high- and medium-priorities to form GSAs and prepare GSPs; or else risk "state intervention"
 - Owens Valley Groundwater Basin (Basin) rated medium-priority basin by DWR
- ▶ In 2017, Inyo and Mono local governments and public agencies discuss forming GSA
- Inyo County prepares draft joint powers agreement (JPA); Mono County submits changes and comments aimed at ensuring Mono County citizens have adequate representation in decisions affecting them; these were rejected
- 13 local governments and public agencies execute JPA to form OVGA
- In 2018, OVGA awarded DWR grant to prepare GSP for Basin; hires consultant; begins preparing GSP
- In 2019, DWR rerates Basin as a low-priority
 - No SGMA requirement to form GSA or prepare GSP for Basin AND no "state intervention"
 - Several agencies withdraw from OVGA (including TriValley and Wheeler Crest)
 - Mono County remains OVGA member; commits to GSP "preparation"

Recent & Current OVGA Activities

- In 2019, after the withdrawal of several agencies, OVGA decides to continue with GSP prep
- Consultant continues to prepare GSP
 - Collects groundwater and other data from public agencies
 - Presentations on preliminary data and GSP prep process to OVGA board
- In 2020, OVGA adds Owens Valley Committee (envt'l org) and Lone Paiute Shoshone Tribe (tribal gov) to OVGA board of directors as interested parties
- Consultant continues to prepare GSP
 - Begin discussing undesirable results and sustainability criteria
- Preparation of Community/Stakeholder Engagement Plan
 - Required by SGMA
 - Still determining how to conduct outreach to communities and stakeholders
- Consultant continues to prepare GSP

Recent TriValley Activities & Request to Withdraw

- ▶ In 2019, TriValley withdraws from OVGA after DWR rerates Basin a low-priority
 - Low priority means SGMA GSA and GSP requirements no longer apply; no state intervention
- ▶ In 2020, TriValley begins process of regaining its GSA status
- Remains concerned about OVGA regulation of groundwater extraction and use if GSP implemented and enforced
 - Especially by OVGA that is not accountable to TriValley citizens and residents
 - May adversely affect agricultural activities/operations in TriValley
- Requests Mono County withdraw from OVGA
 - Withdrawal protects Mono County (including TriValley) from OVGA implementation/enforcement of GSP

Implications of County Withdrawal

- GSP will be required if Basin rerated high- or medium-priority; avoid state intervention
- 1. Remain OVGA Member & Withdraw Once GSP Prepared
 - County to continue to represent Mono County interests and provide comments during GSP prep based on concerns of Mono County, citizens, residents
 - Evaluate final GSP and then decide to remain/withdraw from OVGA
 - Withdrawal prevents OVGA implementation/enforcement of GSP in Mono County
- 2. Withdraw from OVGA Immediately
 - Prevents County from participating and influencing GSP "from the inside"
 - Eliminates possibility of GSP implementation/enforcement in Mono County
 - Does not mean no GSA for Mono portion of Basin; Mono County and its local public agencies can form GSA and coordinate with OVGA GSP
- 3. Remain an OVGA Member
 - Final GSP may be implemented/enforced in Mono County (including TriValley)
 - OVGA not accountable to Mono County citizens and residents

Staffing Issues

- Both Remaining and Withdrawing options raise staffing issues
- County Remains OVGA Member
 - Continued Community Development Dept staffing related to GSP review and preparation and Community/Stakeholder Engagement Plan implementation
 - Ongoing County Counsel Office staffing of OVGA board meetings and administration, GSP review and preparation, governance issues
- County Withdraws from OVGA
 - Community Development Dept and County Counsel Office staffing of "Mono County GSA" - formation, board administration, governance
 - "Mono County" GSP preparation and possible implementation
