



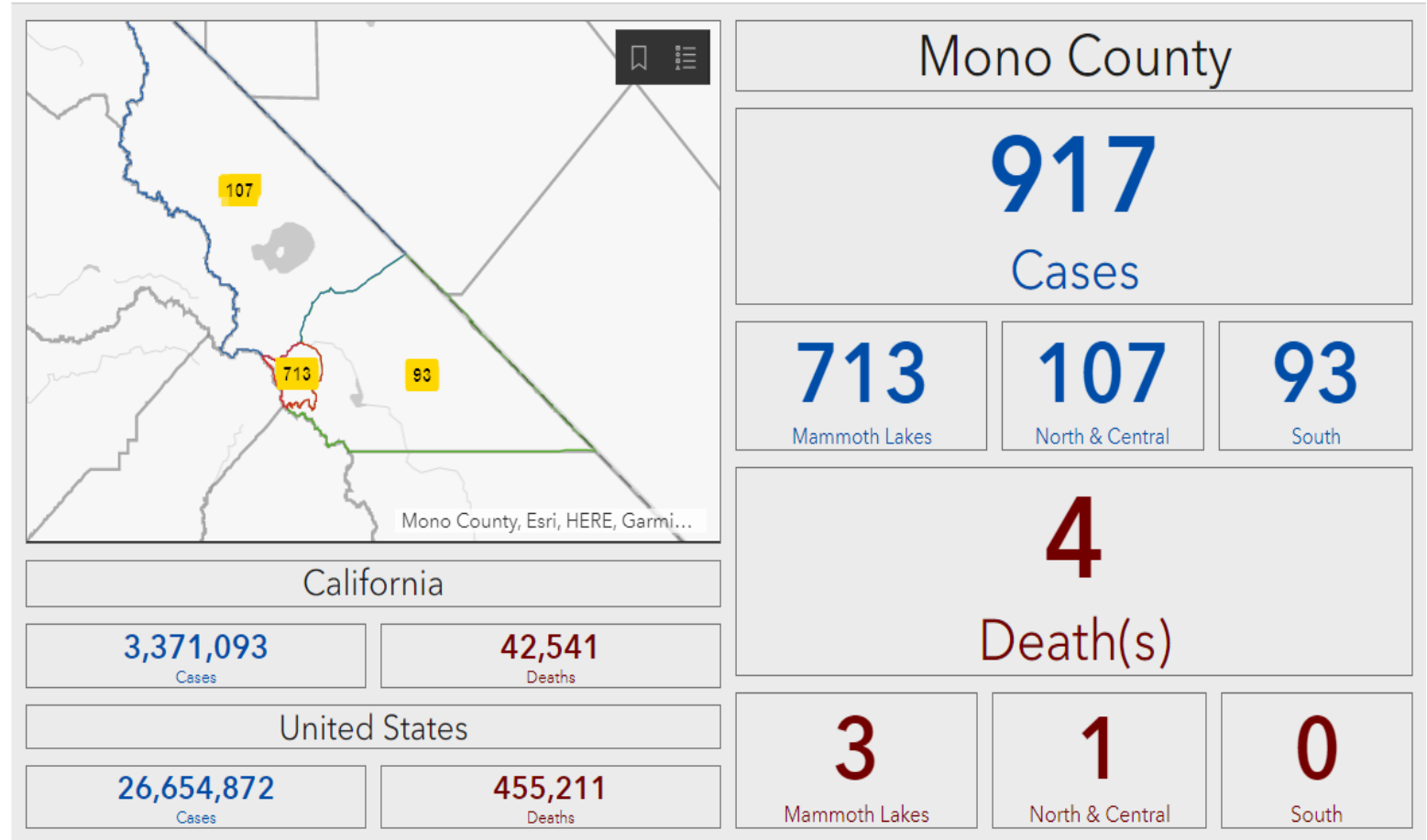

Mono County and CA Case Summary By Area

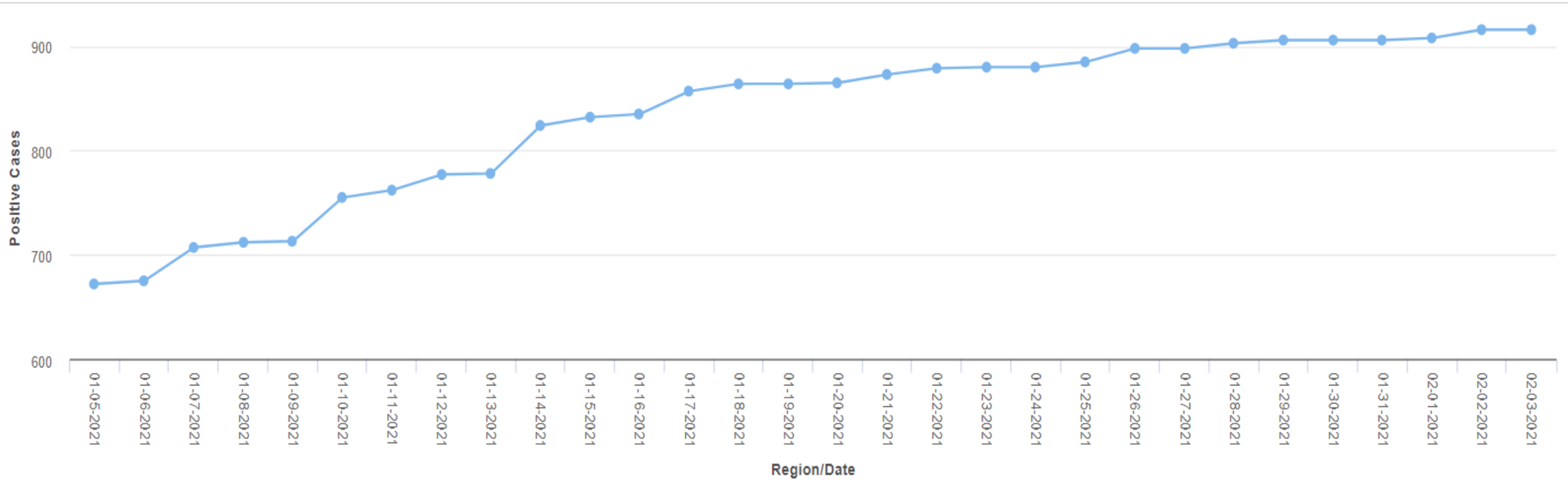
MONO COUNTY CASES BY REGION



As of February 4, 2021



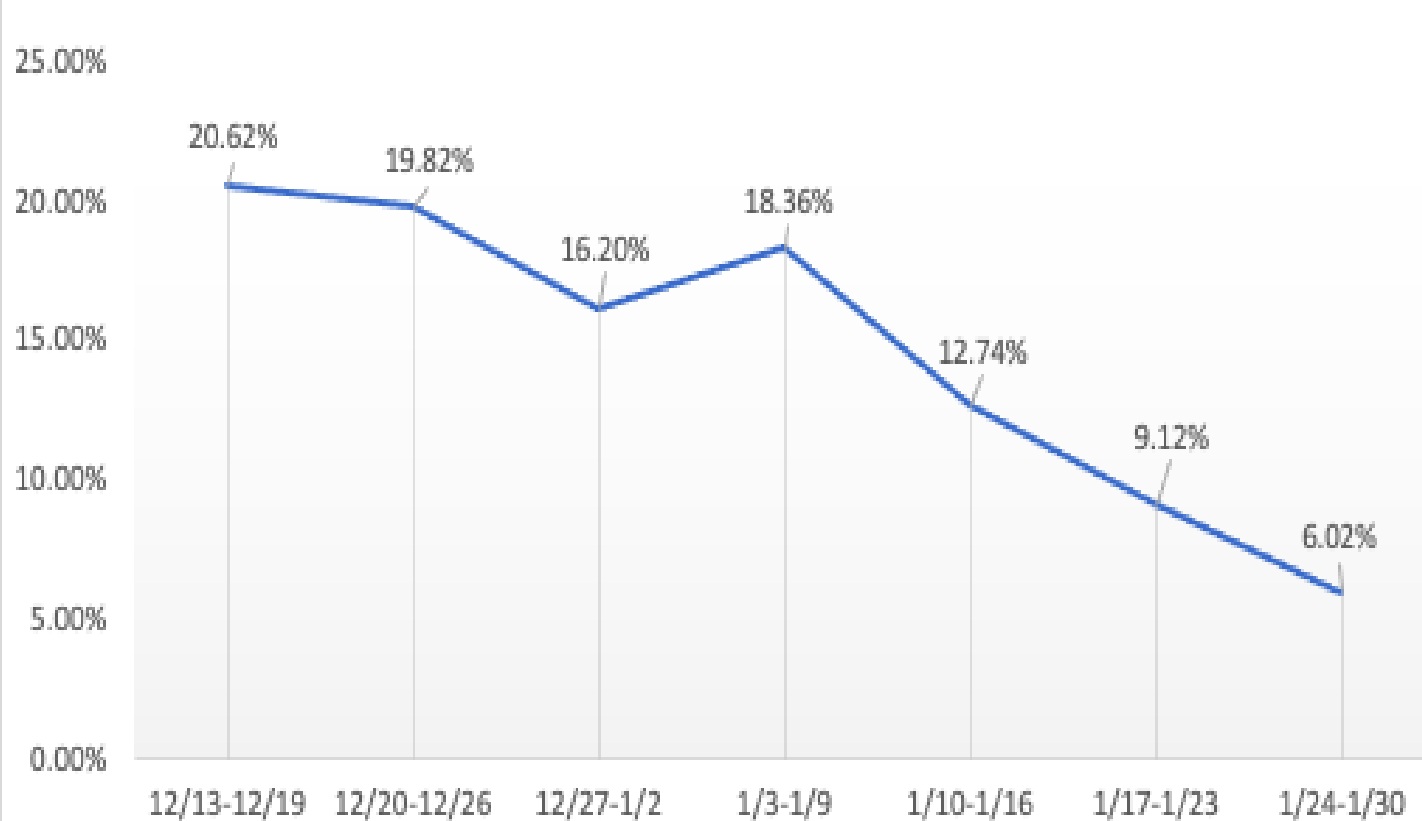
Total Positive Cases for Mono County Residents (last 30 d...



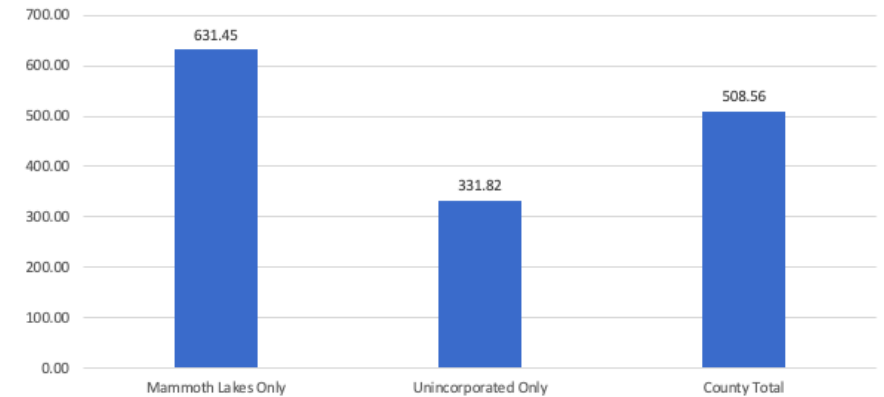

BLUEPRINT FOR A SAFER ECONOMY – PURPLE TIER



- Mono County data* used to determine Tier Status:
 - **17.4** Case Rate/100,000
 - **6.6%** Testing Positivity rate
- A county must have been in the current tier for a **minimum of three weeks**.
- A county must meet criteria for the next less restrictive tier for both measures for the **prior two consecutive weeks** in order to progress to the next tier.

SCHOOL GUIDANCE



CA Safe Schools for All

- Guidance states that if schools have not re-opened, **Grades 7-12 can only open in the Red Tier**
- Grades K-6 can open in the Purple Tier if the case rate is below **25 cases per 100,000/day for 5 consecutive days** (currently 29.7)
- Mammoth Unified School District (MUSD) can only reopen for **in-person Elementary School instruction** when the Mono County case rate falls **below 25/100,000**, and for middle and high school when we attain Red Tier status.
- As per the Blueprint for a Safer Economy. Schools that have already re-opened, like ESUSD (1/19) can remain open even if the tier position worsens.

COVID-19 VACCINATION PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY REQUIRED



- Vaccines are allocated by the state according to permanent resident population, so vaccination appointments are only for people who work or live in Mono County, regardless of immigration status.
- To ensure Mono County is administering vaccines according to State guidelines, proof of eligibility is now required at the vaccination clinic.
- Proof of Mono County residence or employment is required. This includes, but is not limited to:
 - Driver's license/Real ID
 - Employment paystub
 - Note from employer
 - Employee ID
 - Any document that verifies you as a Mono County, full-time resident (second homeowners are not eligible to receive the vaccine in Mono County)

PRE-REGISTER FOR THE VACCINE


STEP 1 

Pre-register yourself to be vaccinated by completing the online confidential Vaccine Questionnaire. Hold your camera to the QR code and open the Vaccine Questionnaire, or visit webapp.mono.ca.gov/covid19/vaccinate-mono-form.


Call (760) 924-1830 and follow the vaccination prompts for help completing the vaccine questionnaire or for vaccine questions. Be prepared to leave a short message with your name and phone number.

Email COVID19help@mono.ca.gov for help completing the vaccine questionnaire or for vaccine questions.


The completion of the vaccine questionnaire does not automatically register you for your vaccination. Once clinics are scheduled for your established criteria you will receive an invitation at the appointed time to register for your first and second vaccination. Clinics are by appointment ONLY.

STEP 2 

Once clinics are scheduled for each tier/phase, you will receive an invitation at the appointed time to register for your first and second vaccination. Please do not arrive at any clinic unless you have an appointment. On-site registration is not available at this time and slows down the vaccination process for others. Vaccination appointments are for people who work or live in Mono County, regardless of immigration status. Your ID or proof of local employment and/or full-time residence may be required at the vaccination clinic.

STEP 3 


Arrive at your clinic at your appointed time. Wear a t-shirt under your layers. You will receive your vaccination card on-site, which you will need for your second vaccination.

STEP 4 

Continue to keep wearing a mask, wash your hands, stay 6 feet apart, and do not gather indoors with those outside of your immediate household unit until the vaccine has been widely distributed.

PREINSCRIPCIÓN PARA LA VACUNA


PASO 1 

Completa el cuestionario confidencial en línea a preinscribirse para la vacuna. Sostenga la cámara sobre el código QR y abra el cuestionario o visite webapp.mono.ca.gov/covid19/vaccinate-mono-form.


Llama al (760) 924-1830 y siga las indicaciones para la vacuna para recibir asistencia en completar el cuestionario o si tiene preguntas sobre la vacuna. Esté preparado para dejar un mensaje corto con su nombre y número de teléfono.

Envíe un correo electrónico a COVID19help@mono.ca.gov para asistencia a completar el cuestionario o si tiene preguntas sobre la vacuna.


Al completar el cuestionario de la vacuna no lo inscribe automáticamente para su vacunación. Una vez que las clínicas estén programadas por los criterios establecidos a que pertenece, recibirá una invitación a la hora designada para registrarse por su primera y segunda vacunación. Las clínicas son por cita solamente.

PASO 2 

Una vez que las clínicas estén programadas para cada nivel y fase, recibirá una invitación a la hora designada de su inscripción por su primera y segunda vacunación. Favor no llegue a ninguna clínica a menos que tenga una cita. Inscripción en el sitio no está disponible en este momento y retrasará el proceso de vacunación para los demás. Las citas de vacunación son para personas que trabajan o viven en el condado de Mono, independientemente de su estado migratorio. Es posible que se requiera su identificación o comprobante de empleo local y/o residencia a tiempo completo en la clínica de vacunación.

PASO 3 

Llegue a su clínica a la hora indicada. Use una camiseta debajo de sus capas de ropa. Recibirá su tarjeta de vacunación que necesitará para su segunda vacunación.

PASO 4 

Continúe poniéndose la mascarilla, lavándose las manos, manteniéndose 6 pies de distancia y no reunirse adentro con personas que no sean parte de su hogar inmediato hasta que la vacuna se haya distribuido ampliamente. #VacunarMono

WHERE ARE WE NOW?

Mono County is now vaccinating residents aged **55 years and older** with **certain underlying medical conditions**, including **pregnant women of any age**. These individuals are at increased risk for severe illness from the virus that causes COVID-19. Some of the higher risk underlying medical conditions include:

- Cancer
- Chronic kidney disease
- COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease)
- Down Syndrome
- Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, or cardiomyopathies
- Immunocompromised state (weakened immune system) from solid organ transplant
- Obesity (body mass index [BMI] of 30 kg/m² or higher but < 40 kg/m²)
- Severe Obesity (BMI ≥ 40 kg/m²)
- Pregnancy
- Sickle cell disease
- Smoking
- Type 2 diabetes mellitus

VACCINATION FAQ'S – THE TOP QUESTIONS



I got Vaccinated, can I stop wearing a mask?

Not at this time – There are still so many unknowns and unanswered questions.

- We still need to understand a number of things better, including **whether vaccinated people can still be silently infected and spread to other people and how long the protection from the vaccine lasts.**
- The vaccines are not **100% effective** - a few vaccinated people still got sick in the clinical trials.
- Concerns right now that the **vaccine might not work as well against one or more of the new mutant strains of the virus** that are appearing and spreading (no evidence of that yet, but now is NOT the time to relax any safety measures).
- Relatively few people have been vaccinated in California so far it makes sense to **continue to expect everyone to wear a mask.**
- Please keep in mind too that there is a good chance that you would make others **uncomfortable by going without a mask.**

TESTING FOR COVID-19 DURING THE ROLLOUT OF VACCINES



- **Wear facemasks:** Even after getting both doses of the vaccine, it's possible, though not likely, to get COVID-19. If you get COVID-19 after being vaccinated you may not get sick, but you may still be able to spread it to your family and friends.
- **Stay home if sick:** If you feel sick, you should stay home and isolate from others.
Get tested: If you have symptoms or have been exposed to with someone with COVID-19 you should get tested. This is true even after being vaccinated. **Tests for COVID-19 work the same in vaccinated people as they do in unvaccinated people.**
- **Testing keeps you, your family, and friends safe.**
- **If your job requires it, you still need to get tested regularly. Even if you had the vaccine.**
- **Wash hands:** Wash your hands often with soap and water. You can use a hand sanitizer with 60% alcohol to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- **Physical Distance:** Keep at least 6 feet away from people who do not live in your household.
- **Gather outside and increase airflow in indoor spaces:** If the weather permits, **outdoor events are much safer than indoor events.**
