

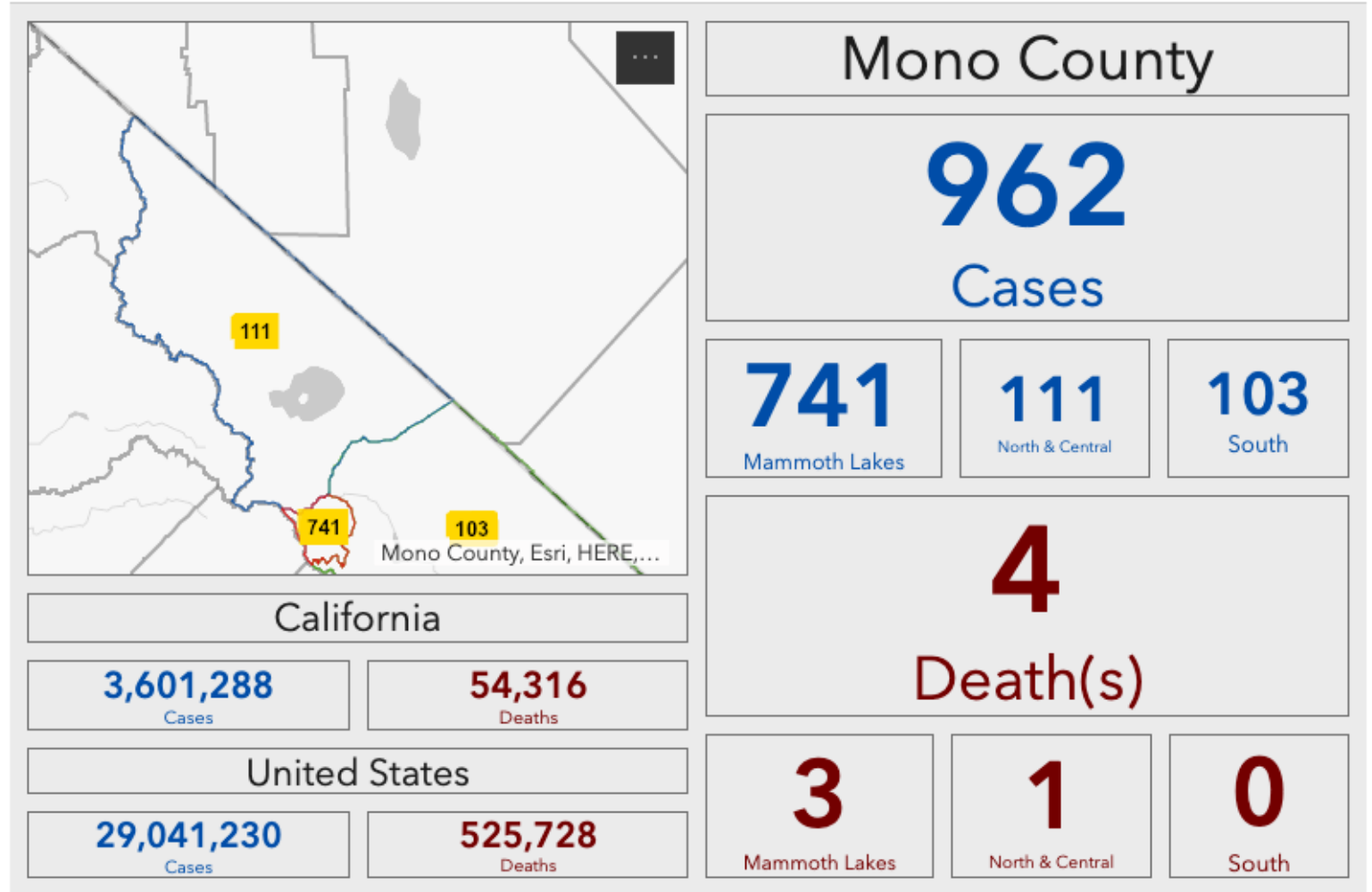

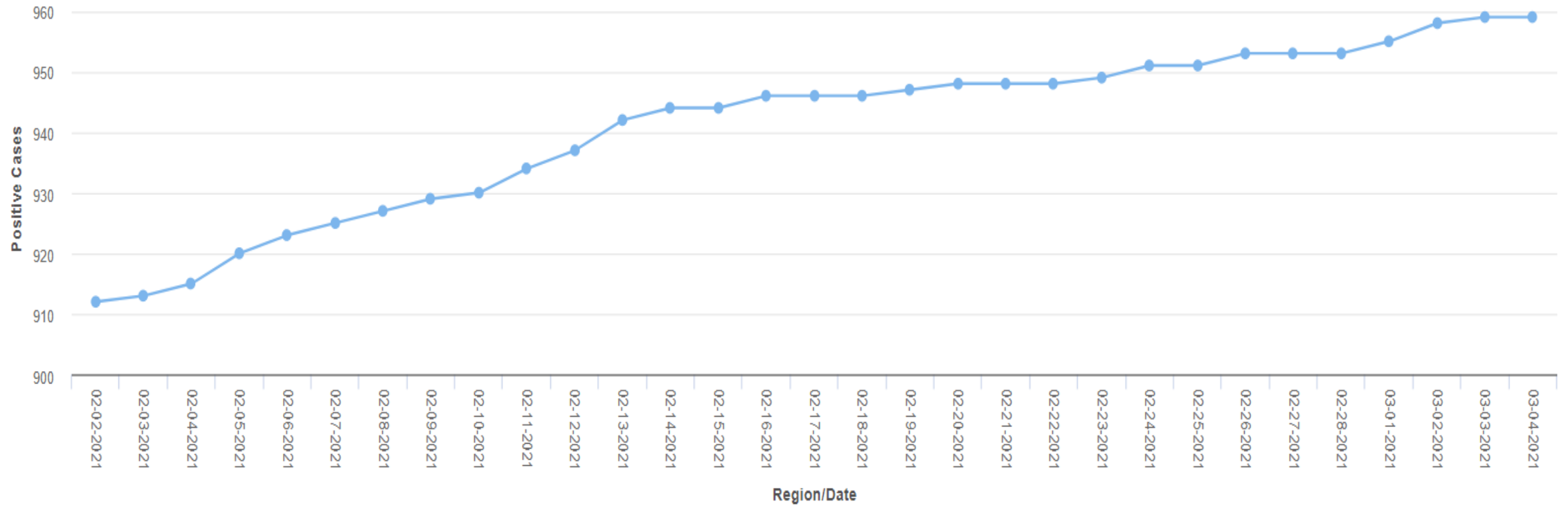

Mono County and CA Case Summary By Area



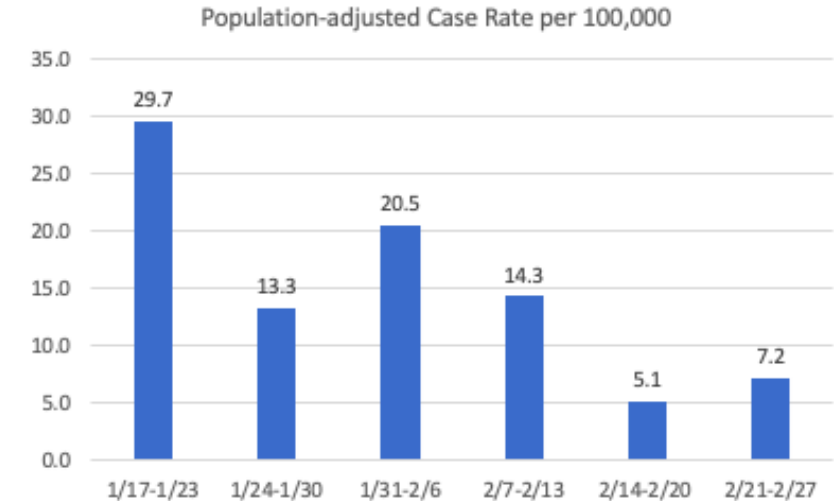
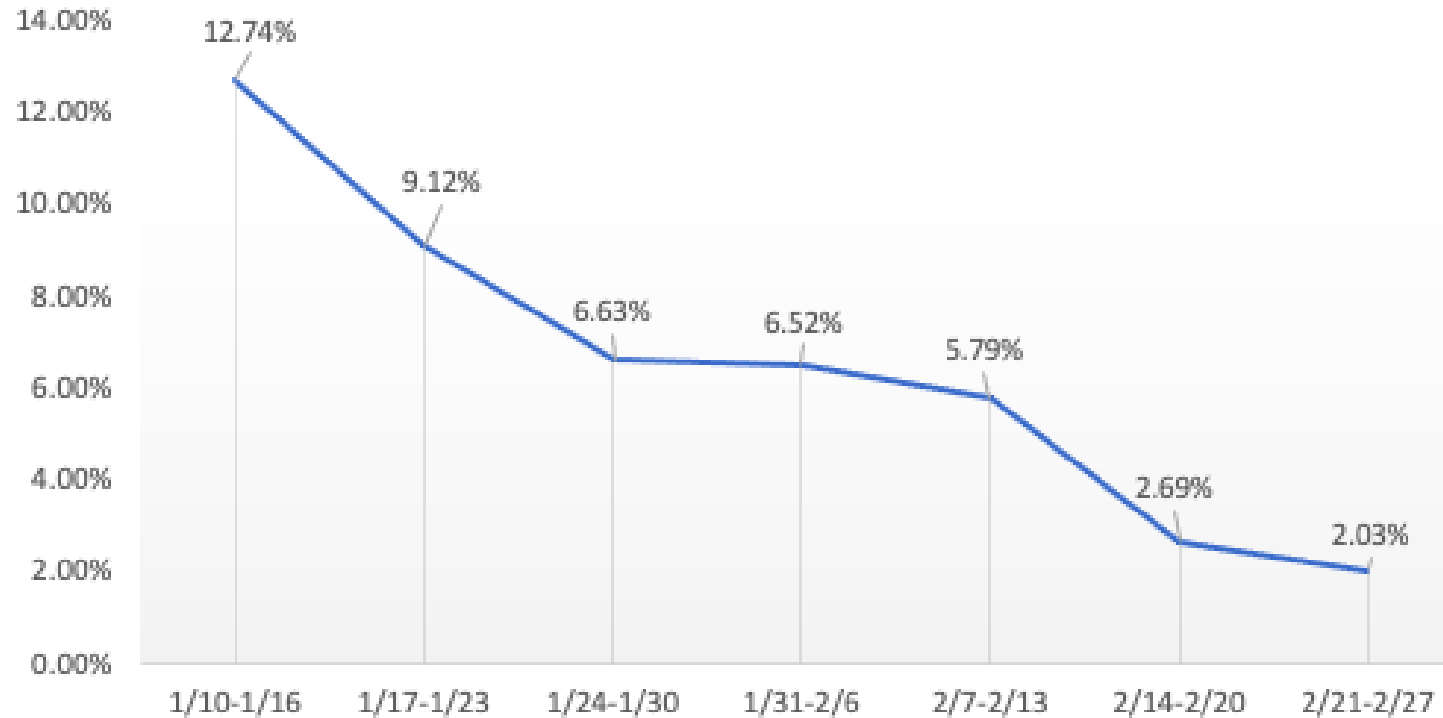
MONO COUNTY CASES BY REGION

The state reports everything on a week-by-week basis with a 7-day average and a 7-day lag. They send us their published data every Monday for the prior complete week. Because there is a significant delay in this, PH obtain a report from CDPH every week to reconcile county data and be able to push out something a little more current for us to use. Today's report is current through the reporting period ending on 2/27.

Testing data is received from multiple sources and aggregated into the county database. Due to the potential for delays in receiving results, all data is subject to change as testing data is received. For these same reasons, **rates reflected here may not match current state reports**

BLUEPRINT FOR A SAFER ECONOMY

State Metrics as of February 27:

- Case Rate/100,000: 7.2
 - Testing Positivity rate: 2.0%
- A county must have been in the current tier for a **minimum of three weeks**. *Mono County entered the Purple Tier on January 25, 2021.*
- A county must meet criteria for the next less restrictive tier for both measures for the **prior two consecutive weeks** in order to progress to the next tier.
- As the metrics show, we have officially met both the Testing Positivity rate (5-8%) and the Case Rate of less than 4-7 cases per 100,000 for the Red Tier for **ONE WEEK**.

BLUEPRINT UPDATE: MARCH 4TH

Statewide Vaccine Equity Metric Goal #1:

Purple (Widespread) tier will shift from greater than 7 cases per 100,000 to greater than 10 cases per 100,000; and the Red (Substantial) tier will be widened to 4-10 cases per 100,000 when:

- 2 million doses have been administered to persons living in the Vaccine Equity Quartile. (assessed statewide). Orange (Moderate) and Yellow (Minimal) tier ranges will remain the same.

Statewide Vaccine Equity Metric Goal #2:

Purple (Widespread) tier threshold will remain at greater than 10 cases per 100,000, Red (Substantial) tier case rate range will narrow to 6-10 cases per 100,000; and the Orange (Moderate) tier case rate range will shift to 2-5.9 cases per 100,000. The Yellow (Minimal) tier case rate range will shift to less than 2 cases per 100,000 when:

- 4 million doses have been administered to persons living in the Vaccine Equity Quartile (assessed statewide).

MUSD UPDATE



RE-OPENING DATES:

- Mammoth Elementary opened on March 1 for TK through grade 2
- Grades 3-5 will open March 8
- Mammoth Middle School - plan to reopen beginning March 15
- Mammoth High School - plan to reopen beginning March 22

INFORMATION:

- If the county does not officially enter the Red Tier on March 10, the reopening dates could be delayed.
- All students and staff will need to wear a mask at all times.
- No visitors, volunteers or parents allowed into school buildings
- The MES program will be a "hybrid" or partial day program with AM/PM sessions Mondays through Thursdays, and then distance learning for all on Fridays.
- We will continue to offer the MILES program for students who want to remain on distance learning.
- We are not able to offer bus transportation to the general student population at this time due to several obstacles related to physical distancing and bus capacity.
- We are able to provide a free to-go meal to every student every day as they leave school.

GET VACCINATED TODAY!




- California is now administering **3 million vaccines weekly**, up from its current pace of **1.4 million**.
- **9,673,787** Californians have been vaccinated with at least one dose.
- Goal is highly dependent on supply.
- California is set to receive **380,000 doses** of the single-dose **Johnson & Johnson** vaccine this week — received emergency use authorization (2/27/2021) from the FDA
- California is scheduled to receive around **1.6 million doses** of the Pfizer and Moderna vaccine.

WHERE ARE WE NOW?

Mono County is now vaccinating residents aged **16 years and older** with **certain underlying medical conditions**, AND residents **50 years or older**. Some of the higher risk underlying medical conditions include:

- Cancer, current with weakened immune system
- Chronic kidney disease, stage 4 or above
- Chronic pulmonary disease, oxygen dependent
- Down syndrome
- Solid organ transplant, leading to a weakened immune system
- Pregnancy
- Sickle cell disease
- Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, or cardiomyopathies (but not hypertension)
- Severe obesity (Body Mass Index ≥ 40 kg/m²)
- Type 2 diabetes mellitus with hemoglobin A1c level greater than 7.5%
- Asthma (moderate-to-severe)
- Cerebrovascular disease (affects blood vessels and blood supply to the brain)
- Cystic fibrosis
- Hypertension or high blood pressure
- Immunocompromised state (weakened immune system) from blood or bone marrow transplant, immune deficiencies, HIV, use of corticosteroids, or use of other immune weakening medicines
- Neurologic conditions, such as dementia
- Liver disease
- Overweight (BMI > 25 kg/m², but < 30 kg/m²)
- Pulmonary fibrosis (having damaged or scarred lung tissues)
- Thalassemia (a type of blood disorder)
- Type 1 diabetes mellitus

COVID-19 VACCINATION PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY REQUIRED



- Vaccines are allocated by the state according to permanent resident population, so vaccination appointments are only for people who work or live in Mono County, regardless of immigration status.
- To ensure Mono County is administering vaccines according to State guidelines, proof of eligibility is now required at the vaccination clinic.
- **Proof of Mono County residence or employment is required at the clinic with your name on it.**
- Examples: Driver's license, business card, work ID, library card, letter from your employer or school, bank/ATM cards, electrical bill, matricula consular, paystub, passport, money transfer receipt, etc. Please note that the document **does not** need to be a government-issued ID to receive a vaccine.
- Any document that verifies you as a Mono County, full-time resident
- **Second homeowners are not currently eligible to receive the vaccine in Mono County**

NEW: MY TURN

- The California Department of Public Health is transitioning all California counties to the *My Turn* platform for COVID-19 vaccine registration.
- Mono County has piloting the My Turn platform, but the majority of clinics are being scheduled using existing PrepMod system.
- Pre-registered individuals will receive an email from Mono County Public Health to register with My Turn.
- Continue to pre-register for the vaccine by completing the online vaccine questionnaire



COVID-19 vaccination: Find out if it's your turn

Everyone in California will have an opportunity to get vaccinated against COVID-19 at no cost. But our vaccination supply is limited right now. So we're starting with the groups who are at highest risk, like people with a high chance of exposure and people 65 and older.

Are you eligible?

Find out if it's your turn by answering a few questions. It only takes a few minutes. If you're eligible and vaccine appointments are available through My Turn, you can schedule one. If it's not your turn yet or appointments are not available, you can register to be notified when you're eligible or when appointments open up.

CDPH COVID-19 QUARANTINE GUIDANCE FOR FULLY VACCINATED PEOPLE



On February 10, CDC updated COVID-19 quarantine guidance for fully vaccinated people. CDPH supports this guidance, which is stated below:

- Vaccinated persons with an exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 are not required to quarantine if they meet all of the following criteria:
 - Are fully vaccinated (i.e., ≥ 2 weeks following receipt of the second dose in a 2-dose series, or ≥ 2 weeks following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine)
 - Are within 3 months following receipt of the last dose in the series
 - Have remained asymptomatic since the current COVID-19 exposure
- Persons who do not meet all 3 of the above criteria should continue to follow current CDPH quarantine guidance after exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19.
- **Fully vaccinated persons who do not quarantine should still watch for symptoms of COVID-19 for 14 days following an exposure.** If they experience symptoms, they should be clinically evaluated for COVID-19, including SARS-CoV-2 testing, if indicated. In addition, they should respond to calls or texts from their local health department and engage in contact tracing efforts if requested to do so.

CDC PUBLIC HEALTH RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FULLY VACCINATED PEOPLE

Key Points

This is the first set of public health recommendations for fully vaccinated people. This guidance will be updated and expanded based on the level of community spread of SARS-CoV-2, the proportion of the population that is fully vaccinated, and the rapidly evolving science on COVID-19 vaccines.

For the purposes of this guidance, people are considered fully vaccinated for COVID-19 ≥ 2 weeks after they have received the second dose in a 2-dose series (Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna), or ≥ 2 weeks after they have received a single-dose vaccine (Johnson and Johnson [J&J]/Janssen).¹

The following recommendations apply to non-healthcare settings.

Fully vaccinated people can:

- Visit with other fully vaccinated people indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing
- Visit with unvaccinated people from a single household who are at low risk for severe COVID-19 disease indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing
- Refrain from quarantine and testing following a known exposure if asymptomatic

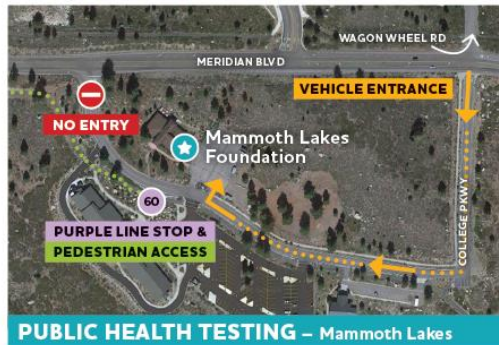
