






Total Positive Cases for Mono County Residents (last 30 d...






TOTAL POSITIVE CASES: 1284 (30-DAY INCREASE: 9.7%) / CASE RATE / 100,000: 34.8






POST VACCINATION INFECTIONS (BREAKTHROUGH)



HOSPITAL STATUS

- No current COVID-19 related hospitalizations.
- Transfer hospitals continue to experience extremely limited ICU capacity causing delays or the inability to transfer patients in a timely manner.

FEDERAL VACCINE MANDATE

- Requiring Vaccinations for all Federal Workers and for Millions of Contractors that Do Business with the Federal Government.
- Requiring COVID-19 Vaccinations for Over 17
 Million Health Care Workers at Medicare and Medicaid Participating Hospitals and Other Health Care Settings.
- Requiring All Employers with 100+ Employees to Ensure their Workers are Vaccinated or Tested Weekly.
- Calling on Large Entertainment Venues to Require Proof of Vaccination or Testing for Entry.



MAMMOTH UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT UPDATE

- On 9/17, we received news that there were 21 positive cases within MUSD from our Monday testing clinic.
- Several of those cases impacted MUSD's ability to operate in-person instruction at Mammoth Middle School and High School.
- A lack of available staff due to the State's quarantine guidelines lead to the MUSD closure.

MONO COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH ASSISTANCE

- Met with MUSD on Friday to mitigate overall response.
- Connected with State over the weekend to request additional resources to expedite return to in-person instruction.
- Secured assistance from the State's Outbreak Response Team 9/21:
 - Initiating a test-to-return program that may allow for a return to in-person instruction on 9/28.
 - Program set to begin 9/22 or 9/23.

SCHOOL AGED CHILDREN STATS

SINCE 8/15/21:

- 159 total cases in Mono (all ages)
 - 41 of these <18 years old</p>
 - = 25.8% of cases occurred in children

LIMITED STATE RESOURCES AND INCREASED TESTING

- State resources, both human and material, are in short supply.
- We continue to experience staffing shortages for response teams, testing sites, and contact tracing.
- Demand for testing remains high due to increased infection rate, school testing, and required workforce testing.
- Limited supplies of some testing materials and N95 masks.


BOOSTER SHOTS FOR A SELECT GROUP

- Active treatment for solid tumor and hematologic malignancies.
- Receipt of solid-organ <u>transplant</u> and taking immunosuppressive therapy.
- Receipt of CAR-T-cell or hematopoietic stem cell transplant (within 2 years of transplantation or taking immunosuppression therapy).
- Moderate or severe <u>primary immunodeficiency</u> (e.g., DiGeorge syndrome, Wiskott-Aldrich syndrome).
- Advanced or untreated <u>HIV infection.</u>
- Active treatment with high-dose corticosteroids (i.e., ≥20mg prednisone or equivalent per day), alkylating agents, antimetabolites, transplant-related immunosuppressive drugs, cancer chemotherapeutic agents classified as severely immunosuppressive, tumor-necrosis (TNF) blockers, and other biologic agents that are immunosuppressive or immunomodulatory.
