




POST VACCINATION INFECTIONS (BREAKTHROUGH)

Percentage of Total



COVID VACCINE SCHOOL MANDATE

- California Becomes First State in Nation to Announce COVID-19 Vaccine Requirements for Schools:
 - After implementing first-in-the-nation school masking and staff vaccination measures, California becomes the first state to announce plans to require student vaccinations – adding the COVID-19 vaccine to list of vaccinations required for school, such as the vaccines for measles, mumps, and rubella.
 - Students will be required to be vaccinated for in person learning starting the term following FDA full approval of the vaccine for their grade span (7-12 and K-6).
 - Vaccinations for 5 11-year-old expected to have EUA between Halloween and Thanksgiving.

MERCK APPLIES FOR EUA FOR ANTIVIRAL TO TREAT COVID

- Merck & Co. and partner Ridgeback
 Biotherapeutics LP said Monday they have filed an application asking U.S. health regulators to authorize their Covid-19 pill, the next step toward adding a long-sought drug for use at home.
- The filing comes shortly after <u>data from a late-stage</u> <u>study showed</u> that the antiviral drug, molnupiravir, cut the risk of hospitalization or death by about 50% in high-risk people with mild to moderate COVID-19.

BOOSTER SHOTS FOR THOSE WITH COMPROMISED IMMUNE SYSTEMS

- Active treatment for solid tumor and hematologic <u>malignancies.</u>
- Receipt of solid-organ <u>transplant</u> and taking immunosuppressive therapy.
- Receipt of CAR-T-cell or hematopoietic stem cell <u>transplant</u> (within 2 years of transplantation or taking immunosuppression therapy).
- Moderate or severe primary immunodeficiency (e.g., DiGeorge syndrome, Wiskott-Aldrich syndrome).
- Advanced or untreated <u>HIV infection.</u>
- Active treatment with high-dose corticosteroids (i.e., ≥20mg prednisone or equivalent per day), alkylating agents, antimetabolites, transplant-related <u>immunosuppressive drugs</u>, cancer chemotherapeutic agents classified as severely immunosuppressive, tumor-necrosis (TNF) blockers, and other biologic agents that are immunosuppressive or immunomodulatory.

PFIZER BOOSTERS FOR THE GENERAL POPULATION

- COVID-19 Vaccine booster shots are available for the following Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine recipients who completed their initial series at least 6 months ago:
 - 65 years and older
 - 18+ who have <u>underlying medical conditions</u>
 - 18+ who work in <u>high-risk settings</u>
 - 18+ who live in <u>high-risk settings</u>
- <u>Moderna and J&J booster guidance</u> <u>expected soon but no date or information</u> <u>regarding eligibility</u>
