

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



What is recyclable at the County Transfer Stations (TS)?

Glass, plastic, aluminum, cardboard, batteries, used oil, and HHW are all accepted for FREE.

Where else can I take it?

Recyclables can also be taken to various non-county facilities and programs in Mono County that accept recyclables. Some of these facilities pay market rates for certain recyclables. The TS Attendant can provide a map of these facilities at your request.

Where does the recycling go?

Recyclables collected at the Bridgeport and Walker TSs are shipped to a processing center in Gardnerville, NV. Recyclables collected at Pumice Valley and south are taken to a processing facility in Big Pine. From these centers, the commodities are shipped and sold to market.

Why don't I get paid to drop recyclables at the County?

The County's program was designed in order to encourage and enable recycling in the county, but the infrastructure that facilitates the marketing of recyclables (scales, crushers, balers, storage and transportation) have not yet been invested in. With the County's current infrastructure,

the cost of transportation of the materials is greater than the price the county receives for the materials once delivered to market.

Why should I recycle?

Although the County does not pay for recyclables, recycling does pay. By reducing the volume of garbage you take to the TS, or have picked up by a waste hauler, you save money. Of course, recycling is the environmentally responsible choice.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE—Leftover household products that contain corrosive, toxic, ignitable, or reactive ingredients are considered to be household hazardous waste (HHW). Some examples are old gasoline, paints, cleaners, oils, batteries, and pesticides. Disposing of HHW in the trash is dangerous and ILLEGAL—they are accepted for FREE at all TSs, so please separate and dispose of them properly!



USED OIL AND FILTERS—The county accepts used motor oil and filters for free. They are hauled out of the county for later processing. Used motor oil is filtered, refined and re-sold! Oil doesn't get old, it just gets dirty!



ALUMINUM—All aluminum products are accepted for recycling—cans, aluminum foil, pie tins and baking dishes. Please clean any baked-on food from aluminum before placing in bin.



PLASTIC—Number 1 & 2 plastic containers are recyclable at Mono County Transfer Stations. Please **RINSE** any container that held a perishable product and place containers into bins loose—not in bags.



BATTERIES—are HHW and should never be thrown in the garbage. TSs accept all standard (AA, 9V) batteries, computer batteries, cell phone batteries and automobile batteries (not electric vehicle batteries).



GLASS—All glass containers are accepted at the Transfer Stations. Household glass such as coffee pots, vases and glass cookware are not recyclable at our facilities. Please remove lids from containers and rinse before placing in recycling bins. The weight of glass in a typical garbage can represents as much as 20% of the total weight!



FLOURESCENT BULBS AND MERCURY DEVICES—County TSs accept all fluorescent tubes and other mercury devices such as thermometers, switches, thermostats and barometers. These items are then shipped out of the county and properly disposed.



CARDBOARD—Clean Old Corrugated Cardboard (OCC) is recycled at the TS, but the bins are for clean OCC only. Please keep do not place waxed cardboard, or chip-board (cereal boxes) into the OCC recycling bin.
