Are there any important issues that are not addressed? What do you feel is the biggest community challenge?

- 1. Sunny Slopes Q1 & Q2: Waste of Money
- 2. Water Please FINISH the ball parks before you begin something else. Ball park should have water, bathrooms and electricity. If water is not available fo rthis facility then none of the other projects should be started as they will need water too. Keep sunny slopes (?)
- 3. A few years ago. The RPAC sent out a survey related to the selection of a sign on the South Landing Road. RESULT: Nothing was done!!! Is this going to be a repeat of that survey???
- 4. Related to Q1 for SS residents: There should be a wide place on 395 as at McGee. THe biggest challenge is to provide decent housing for low income people without damaging the beuaty of the surroundings, ie development within existing (?) boundaries. Dog owners/ATV Owners should abide by established rules.
- 5. A previous RPAC group had a goal of "beautification" never implemented What happened? McGee/Long Valley Residents: 4. Encourage commercial development such as the new McGee Creek Bakery, the tree farm and the "U Catch 'Em" trout ponds 5. Oppose further development on previously adopted "scenic highway" designation 6. Oppose long term/storage parking of cars, boats, trailers on shoulder of Crowley Lake Drive. Areas should be open for snow removal, snow storage and emergency parking. 7. Community participation in maintenance of water source (springs). Clean up debris and weeds.
