CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH**Join Our Community to Help Prevent Child Abuse and Neglect**

April was first declared Child Abuse Prevention Month by presidential proclamation in 1983. Since, then April has been a time to acknowledge the importance of families and communities working together to prevent child abuse, and to promote the social and emotional well-being of children and families.

In November of 2001 the Mono County Child Abuse Prevention Council (CAPC) was established. The Mono County CAPC works year-round to lead a community wide effort to reduce child abuse and neglect through supporting training, activities, resources, and programs that encourage safe, healthy, and resilient families!

This year we have Blue Pinwheel displays and Child Abuse Prevention Yard Signs being distributed throughout Mono County. The Blue Pinwheels are the national symbol for child abuse and neglect prevention.

The Mono County CAPC and other agencies have planned activities (see calendar at right) for the month of April to spread awareness about Child Abuse and Neglect in Mono County.

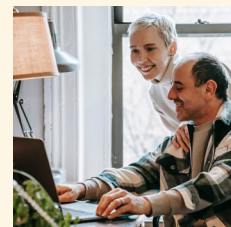
April 26: Introduction to Resilient, Trauma Informed Leadership – Leading with Intentions in the Midst of Chaos

If your child will turn five on or before September 1, 2022, he or she can attend Kindergarten in the fall of 2022. If your child will turn five between September 2, 2022 and February 2, 2023, he or she can attend Transitional Kindergarten in the fall of 2022.

FREE Golden Bear Pass

Did you know that any qualifying person receiving Supplemental Security Income (SSI), any person receiving aid under the CalWORKS Program, or any person 62 years of age or older with income limitations is eligible to receive a free Golden Bear Pass?

The pass provides FREE day-use entry at 200+ state parks and beaches. The passes are valid from January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022.

California's state parks benefit the whole community. The parks are a fun and healthy way to connect with families, friends, and communities.

With 279 state parks, over 340 miles of coastline, 970 miles of lake and river frontage, 15,000 campsites, 5,200 miles of trails, 3,195 historic buildings and more than 11,000 known prehistoric and historic archaeological sites, the department contains the largest and most diverse recreational, natural and cultural heritage holdings of any state agency in the nation.

WORK INNOVATION AND OPPORTUNITY ACT

Updated Reimbursement of 90% of Wages to Employers

Are you an employer looking for help? The specific technical skills you need may be hard to find. The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) On-the-Job Training Program helps you train the right workers to meet your requirements.

This program assists employers with the costs of hiring and training new and advancing employees by offering financial reimbursement of up to 50% of the employee's wages during the training period – **now updated to 90% of the employee's wages for companies with 50 or less employees.**

COVID-19 BOOSTER SHOTS

Boosters are now available for fully vaccinated people age 18 and older!

If it has been six months or more since your second dose of Pfizer or Moderna, or two months or more since your first dose of Johnson & Johnson, make plans to get your boosters.



FREE AT-HOME COVID TESTS

Every home in the U.S. is eligible to order 4 free at-home COVID-19 tests.

The tests are completely free. Orders will usually ship in 7-12 days. Order your tests now so you have them when you need them.
